Monthly Report - August 2025

District 2 Overview

District 2 affiliates continue to grow visibility through **earned media**, **public advocacy**, **and legal action**. Libertarians are making their presence felt in county governments, the courts, and the press — proving that even without massive resources, principled voices can shift public policy and hold officials accountable.

St. Joseph County

- Advocacy & Media: The county party earned media coverage from the South Bend
 Tribune, WSBT, and ABC57 for its role in the South Bend police bodycam fee
 issue. During public comment, half of the speakers were Libertarians or closely
 affiliated with the county party.
 - While the effort did not completely block excessive fees, the public pressure forced the South Bend Common Council to cut proposed fees in half — a tangible victory for accountability and citizen access.
 - The county party is now exploring next steps to pressure the St. Joseph County Council to reduce fees tied to the Sheriff's Department bodycam program.
- **Meetings**: No business meeting was held this month due to lack of quorum. Primary focus is recruiting new Treasurer. Looking at rescheduling monthly meetings in order to get increased presence from members.
- Candidate Recruitment: The affiliate is reviewing previous primary and general election ballots to identify strong potential recruits for local races heading into 2026.

Kosciusko County

- **September 4 (Thursday)** Monthly meeting at **Mi Lindo**, 6:00 PM. Open to members and guests.
- **September 19 (Friday) 3rd Friday Booth**, a public outreach event with literature, conversation, and volunteer engagement.

Elkhart County

- Legal Advocacy & Media: Libertarian member Melissa Kauffman-Miller continues
 to pursue lawsuits exposing financial malfeasance in Elkhart County
 government. These efforts earned media attention from ABC57, bringing critical
 scrutiny to county leadership and shining a light on corruption. Melissa's legal
 actions demonstrate how Libertarians can use every available tool including the
 courts to defend transparency and accountability.
- **Organizational Status**: No new formal party updates this month, but Melissa's efforts have given the Libertarian movement in Elkhart significant visibility.

Marshall County

• Efforts to identify a **new potential chair** have not advanced. Work will continue to reestablish stronger leadership and build an active affiliate.

District 2 Next Steps

- **Expand earned media strategy**: Coordinate with affiliates to maximize press coverage from local advocacy and legal actions.
- **Candidate development:** Continue identifying and recruiting Libertarian-leaning candidates across the district in preparation for the 2026 cycle.
- **Leadership pipeline**: Focus on filling open county leadership positions to ensure organizational continuity.
